Love the Lord your God... and your neighbour as yourself

In this Sunday Gospel (Matthew 22:34-40), Jesus quotes from the Book of Deuteronomy (6:4-5); 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your might' and from the Book of Leviticus (19:18); 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' Jesus places the twofold commandment side by side, and insists that true love of God must be enfleshed in the love of our neighbour. He went on to say that all the Scriptures 'hang on' these two commandments.



The two Commandments are so important together. We see in the world what happens when one is practiced to the extreme without the other. When there is no love of neighbour, people end up using violence in the name of God. When there is no love of God, eventually love is confined only to those we like or 'our own', and others are dispensable, or are turned to mere objects. Only in Christianity are these two spelt out strongly: after all, the God who came to us, came as a neighbour and a brother to us.

In chapter 25 of Matthew's Gospel, a couple of chapters later, Jesus gives us a practical application of these two commandments – that we should even see God in our neighbour: "...inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me".

Pax Christi Aotearoa New Zealand invites you to remember two significant dates in Aotearoa New Zealand's history:

The Declaration of Independence, signed on October 28th, 1835 and invasion of Parihaka on the 5th of November 1881.

The Declaration of Independence was initiated by northern Rangatira. It is considered the first constitutional founding document of Aotearoa New Zealand and is thus the first recognition of New Zealand as an independent entity.

The Parihaka invasion is significant in that it is the first known case of nonviolent resistance in the world. Mahatma Gandhi heard about Parihaka while in South Africa and it inspired him to nonviolent resistance action in India which effectively led to the independence of India in 1948. We ask you to remember these events in your prayers and to pray for the protection and safety of all peace makers and peace builders around the world.
